



Being On Time for School - 9.00am

Over the last year we have tried to relax some aspects of our school day to accommodate the many difficulties Covid-19 has created. One of these challenges has been to the morning routine. We know that some children have struggled with the reopening of school and drop offs have sometimes been difficult. However, after half term we would like to get the routine a little more like it used to be and ensure that children are starting the day in the best way possible. Entrances to the school will remain the same, but we are requesting that parents ensure their children arrive in school with plenty of time.

Our school days starts at 9.00am. Registers in all classes open from 8.45am and close at 9.00am. Therefore, any child who arrives after 9.00am, when the school bell rings, will be registered as 'Late'. Even if a child manages to come through the gates after the bell has sounded, this will still be recorded as a late mark.

If your child is going to be late due to an urgent medical appointment please ensure that the office is informed and have seen proof of the medical appointment either before or after they have attended.

The only way to ensure that your child is not marked as late in the register is for them to be in their class and ready for the school day before 9.00am.

A Late mark ('L' code in the register) is also an unauthorised absence ('U' code in the register). This can count as half a day's absence. If your child arrives late on several occasions, the school will work with you in finding solutions if there are genuine difficulties. However, if lateness persists, you may be invited to a meeting with the Local Authority's Educational Welfare Officer (EWO) and the persistent lateness may well lead to the issuing of a fixed penalty notice.
