by laying items of clothing in a mosaic formation on the field at Perranporth Community School

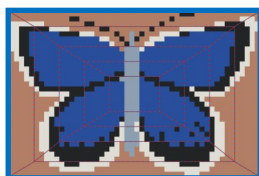
Get involved:
