This week we were very pleased to receive a fantastic set of litter pickers via Mrs Brewer (Caden's mum) and her connections within The Royal Cornwall Hospitals NHS Trust. The plastics used in the litter pickers are made from recycled single use face masks! We were also given an accompanying book, The Carbon Buddy Manual. Our Y2 children will be using the litter pickers to help keep our school community tidy which is wonderful. The purpose of the initiative is to educate our young people on the effects that pollution and waste has on our climate and the detrimental impact this has on our health and wellbeing. The organisation are also launching a competition called "Cornwall Climate Guardians" which we thought families might be interested in...

<u>Competition</u>

The Cornwall Climate Guardian competition has 5 categories based on the "5 steps to Wellbeing. Children can enter:

<u>Take Notice</u> – While using the litter pickers and improving your local environment we are asking for you to show us what you find. The award will go to the person or group who share the most interesting story or item found on their litter picks.

<u>Connect</u> – We know that many of you are doing lots of work to support your environment and we want to hear about it. Tell us about how you or someone you know is making an impact on their communities' environment or working to reduce climate change.

<u>Be Active</u> – In order to support the environment, less is often more. We want to hear how you are ditching the car to travel in a more environmentally friendly way. For this category we want to know how you are choosing to travel differently. The award will go to the individual or group who have the most creative approach to sustainable travel.

<u>Learn</u> – Reducing our waste is really important and we can do this by recycling, reusing or even better buying less. We all need to "Make do and Mend" to ensure we can reuse products. How have you learnt to make do and mend? This award will go to the best example of someone or a group reusing or recycling.

<u>Give</u> – The food we buy and eat has a huge impact on the environment. We are looking for some of the best seasonal recipes for fruits or vegetables for any month of the year. This award will go to the person or group who suggest the best seasonal recipe.
