This term we are having an extra special focus on our Reading Curriculum. As I'm sure you will appreciate, reading is at the heart of a child's learning needs and one of the most important things for a child to develop strength and confidence in. Research has proven that the amount of reading and how often a child reads for pleasure has a direct impact on their academic success throughout their school career. Reading really is the key to learn-

ing!

With this in mind, we are actively encouraging all Perranporth children and families to make a Reading New Year's Resolution! In our assembly this week, we spoke to the children about increasing the amount of time they spend reading at home and sharing a good book with family members. Becoming immersed in a story or sharing a book with someone else is such a special thing and something we'd like our children to take part in as often as possible. Depending on their age of course, we would like to see children reading to a grown up or reading to themselves for a short time every day. As a general rule of thumb, it would be great if children read for roughly the following times:


- Reception: <u>10 minutes every day</u>,
- Year 1 & 2: <u>15-20 minutes every day</u>,
- Year 3 to Year 6: 30 minutes every day

Throughout this term and going forwards, teachers will be encouraging children to earn as many reading certificates (KS1) or to engage with Accelerated Reader (AR) as frequently as possible (KS2). We will contact families to both offer and seek support in this goal.

So, as Dr Suess once said,

"You're never too old, too wacky, too wild, to pick up a book and read to a child."

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School Uniform

In order to comply with Covid-19 government guidance, classroom windows are being left open throughout the day.
