Changes to Reading at Perranporth School

Early Years and Key Stage 1

As parents will no doubt already know, reading is the single most powerful skill a child can learn at school. Reading unlocks the rest of the school curriculum and helps children to become better learners in lots of different subjects too- even maths!



This year at Perranporth School we have changed our approach to the teaching of early reading and phonics. We are now using a brand new phonics scheme called Read Write Inc. This comes along with new teaching and learning approaches and new books too. To fall in with the Read Write Inc approach and research, we will no longer be counting children's reads in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 as we used to. To be absolutely clear, this does not mean that we value reading any less. In fact it's quite the opposite! We still need your help and definitely still want parents and families to read with their child as often as possible; ideally at least three or four times per week, if not every day.

Instead of counting the reads a child does each week, we'll simply be encouraging all children to develop a love of reading and to be reading at school and at home as often as possible. Class teachers will be on the look out for their 'Reader of the Week' and this person will be celebrated in our Friday assembly. Teachers will also still be checking children's reading records to ensure that children are reading regularly at home, so please do continue to help your child keep their reading record up to date. We'll also contact families to offer support where reading at home might be a struggle and isn't happening as often. We very much want to work in partnership with parents and families to make reading a pleasure and a priority for all of our children!

<u>Key Stage 2</u>

For Key Stage 2 (Y3-Y6), things are a little different. Most children in KS2 are using Accelerated Reader or 'AR' to help them track their reading, test their comprehension and make the right book choices too. The AR system has many sophisticated measures within it that helps teachers monitor and assess children's reading. In the past we have celebrated those children who read a million words. This year we're changing our approach.

In KS2 we'll now be taking a whole class 'team approach' to our reading rewards. The AR system allows us to look at how long children have spent reading by how far they are getting in their books and completing quizzes. So, each week teachers will be finding out which class has spent 'the

most time engaged' with reading. We're all a little competitive, so children will be able to see how their class is doing with their reading engagement time compared to the other three on a display. At the end of the term, the class that has spent the most time engaged with reading will receive a reward. Once again, ultimately we want children reading for pleasure and because they can't put down a good book. But for those who aren't the biggest reading fan, we hope a bit of healthy competition will be a good motivator.
