Community Fridge

If you are in need, for free, help yourself to donated food, much of which is very close to it's use-by date.From Monday the 11th of October, our community fridge will be Monday (10-11am) and Wednesday (11am-noon) from <u>St Michaels</u> <u>Church</u> (At the bottom of St Michaels Road, where it joins Perrancoombe).

This is only possible because of phenomenal donations of time by our volunteers, donations from our community and community organisations*. Each week we get food at very
