Morning Routines - A New Year's Resolution?

We have been very pleased with everyone's efforts to make sure that children are in school on time since we altered the morning arrival window to 8:30am - 8:45am. Things have been working well and we're very grateful that families have tried hard to ensure children arrive at school on time.

This term we'd like to make a slight tweak to the routine for some classes, to help the start of the morning operate a little smoother for children. From Monday next week, children in Year 1 and Year 2 will be asked to line up on the playground when the gates open at 8:30am. Mrs Laity or Miss Wright and Mr Barnes will greet their classes, then at 8:35am they will take the line of children inside ready to start their learning as soon as possible. We'd really like to encourage as many children as possible to be in the line each morning to head inside altogether.

In KS1 the first lesson of the day is always phonics which is exceptionally important. We're hopeful that this small change will encourage families to arrive at school in plenty of time to join the line and head into school with their teacher. We're very keen that no child misses any learning in the morning and gets their full entitlement of time. If children arrive after this time, that's still okay, they will just need to head into school as soon as they arrive and get settled as quickly as possible before the 8:45am late bell.

Another change is set for Year 5 children. Also from Monday, we'd like Year 5 children to come into school via the lower gate next to the Year 3 classroom. The children can then walk straight into the school building and avoid losing anytime on the long walk around the playground that they used to do.

For children in Reception, Year 3, Year 4 and Year 6, the morning routine is the exactly the same, we'd just like to encourage everyone to make sure they arrive at school in plenty of time each day.

We firmly believe that children having a smooth, unrushed start to their school day helps everyone have a calm and settled morning. This no doubt also makes for a more focused and productive learning experi-

Keyboard Lessons

For the Spring Term and those children already signed up for lessons, Mr Carter's keyboard sessions will start from Wednesday 11th January. He will teach for 10 weeks finishing on Wednesday 22nd March with a week spare at the end of term for any contingencies.

If your child is interested in taking up keyboard lessons, Mr Carter is a registered provider with the Asone Cornwall Music Education Hub. Parents can pay for sessions or he in some case he can provide free or subsidised lessons to children in receipt of pupil premium. If children meet one of the following criteria and are receiving lessons from a Hub Registered Provider they will be entitled to a 100% subsidy up to £5.00 per lesson:

Currently eligible for Free School Meals (Not including FSM universal entitlement for Infants School pupils)



- Currently in Care If the child meets the following criteria and is receiving lessons – from a Hub Registered Provider they will be entitled 50% subsidy up to £2.50 per lesson:
- Parent/carer in the child's household or child learning is in receipt of Disability Living Allowance (Personal Independence Payment)

• One or more parents/carers in the household are currently serving in the British Armed Forces (As of 1st April 2020)Please note that the subsidy for services families will be reduced from 100% to 50% with effect of 1st April 2020. This is due to the continued increase in the number of children accessing the subsidy scheme but the amount of funding available being fixed. Subsidies apply to only one instrument per child and for a maximum of 39 weeks over the year."
