School Uniform Reminders

As you probably already know, at Perranporth School we're very proud of our school uniform and like our children to look super smart. To this end, we'd really like to enlist parent and family support in making sure we stick to all of the different aspects of school uniform with a few reminders:

- ♦ Children shouldn't wear jewellery. No necklaces/chains, bracelets/wristbands, rings etc and only stud earrings allowed
- ♦ Long hair, (shoulder length or longer), should be tied up
- ♦ Black footwear to be worn on uniform days, (trainers can be worn for PE days)
- ♦ On PE days, only school jumpers/fleeces/cardigans should be worn over PE shirts if needed not hoodies or other sports wear

Just a date for your diary... Start practising your best smile, because on Thursday 28th September children will be having their individual and sibling photographs.






Is my child too ill for school?
