Assessment: Game	Have everyone's addresses written in French- someone reads an address out whose is it?	

Autumn 2 – On the Move END POINT:		
 I can use Je and Tu correctly in a simple sentence I can follow simple directions to find a place on a map 		
Phase 1: Transport	I can name different ways of travelling.	
Phase 2: How do you go to school?	I can ask how someone gets to school and tell them how I get to school	
Phase 3: Directions	I can give and respond to simple direction instructions	
Phase 4: I like to move it	I can say a sequence of movements and follow instructions about directions and actions.	
Phase 5: How do I get to?	I can ask for and give directions to places	
Assessment	Create a map (virtual or physical) – get children working in pairs to give directions	

Spring 1: Going Shopping END POINT:		
 I can recognise, recall and remember items of food and clothing I can say and write phrases that express an opinion 		
Phase 1: Fruit	I can express an opinion in french
