

Our Perranporth GREEN Curriculum created some very engaging learning experiences this week for children in Reception Class and Year 5. Both classes got to share in the scientific expertise of Mr Williamson who is a secondary school physics teacher. To support the children's science learning, Mr Williamson talked to the children all about space and then made rockets with them. Next, the children went on to the school field and launched their rockets! None of them quite made it into orbit, but they did go very high and were extremely

impressive. We'd like to share a huge thank you to Mr Williamson for sharing his knowledge and skills with us. It really was wonderful to see how 'fired up' the children were about their science learning!

Also this week, children took part in very <u>nurturing</u> learning, as we recognized Children's Mental Health Week. 
