Internet Safety - Helpful Video

As we're sure parents and families are very aware, although the internet is full of many fantastic resources, it can also be a very worrying place to navigate for parents of young children. At Perranporth School we keep a close eye on a number of different online safety advice platforms. It's a fun song by London Grid for Learning, helping children to understand the importance of not sharing personal images of themselves online. Although we explicitly teach all of our children about online safety in our computing and PSHE lessons, it's not our intention to share the video at school. However if parents feel it appropriate, you are free to share it with your child at home and use it as a conversation starter to discuss the message and more broadly, how to stay safe online. The danger posed to young children by their presence on social media, in regards to unacceptable requests is sadly an affair that often happens within friend groups or within relationships. Of course the issue of strangers

making the same requests is always present, but these are often teenage concerns. Underneath this lies a more sinister age group that often finds itself targeted almost exclusively by unknown adults online. That sector is the youngest of primary pupils. At primary ages, children are very easily taken advantage of as they are highly impressionable and unaware of the dangers they may be facing. The 'Undressed Song' by the London Grid for Learning, is designed to educate these youngest of pupils on what should and shouldn't be done online.
