Falmouth is the third deepest harbour in the world after Sydney and Rio de Janeiro!

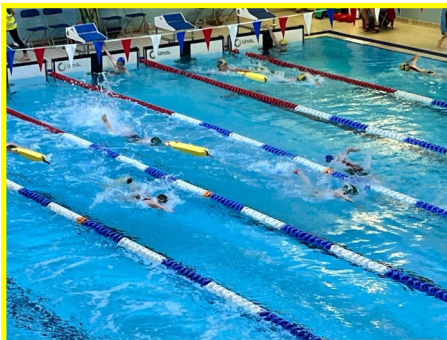
If a woman was sighted on a boat, it would be a sign of bad luck!
