Changes to Waste Disposal – Packed Lunch Waste

New Government legislation around how organisations, including schools, dispose of food waste is coming into effect from after the Easter holiday.

To reduce our food waste, we are asking that all children take home any uneaten food, packaging and containers from their packed lunch or morning snack. This includes fruit peels, yogurt pots, wrappers and leftovers.


We understand this may not be ideal and will work with children to make it as easy and mess-free as possible, for example, by helping children close lids and packed lunch boxes/bags properly. You can help too by using leak proof containers or bags where possible. We will be sharing an assembly with children on this subject next term.

There are some benefits to this approach:

You will be able to see exactly what your child has eaten, helping you make choices that suit their appetite and dietary preferences

There will be less food waste in school, meaning we can target resources on teaching and learning

Less waste will mean having a cleaner site which is better for the environment Greater awareness for children about reducing waste and being responsible for their own rubbish.
