Beach Clean - All Welcome!

We have been asked to share a message from Perranporth Marine Conservation Group.

Our next beach clean is at 11am on Sunday 27th April.

We meet near the surf club and all are welcome to join us. Bring your own bag or bucket, and gloves if you can. We do have these and litter picks, but we often run out! We collect litter from the beach for an hour, (if you can only do 10minutes that's fine, it all helps)

At noon we sort the litter and take away all the hard plastic, fishing line and rope for recycling. We take plastic and glass bottles and cans, wash them out and put them in our domestic recycling at home. If anyone from school would like to take part they just need to turn up at 11am and join in. After School Clubs

After school clubs will start from next Monday. With the start of a new term and a whole new set of after school clubs, we thought it was a good time to share a reminder of our After School Club Behaviour Stages:


- <u>Stage 1</u> In the event of poor behaviour, the child will receive a verbal warning. Continuation of poor behaviour may require 'time out' and parents informed either face to face or via Dojo message
- <u>Stage 2</u> If there are further incidents of poor behaviour in subsequent club sessions, the child will be asked to sit out the remainder of the session. Parents will contacted by a member of staff to discuss the issue, enlist support and try to find a resolution to ensure good behaviour going forwards.
- <u>Stage 3</u> If on the child's return to club, behaviour has still not improved, parents will receive further contact from a member of staff to explain that the child can no longer attend that after school club. Full refunds will be given for any remaining sessions as necessary.

We hope that parents can appreciate that these are not actions we ever wish to take and hopefully never will. However, it is important that clubs remain safe and enjoyable for all children. As ever, thank you for your support.

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School Attendance Reminder

As parents will know from previous newsletters, good school attendance is extremely important and something we try very hard to work with parents to maintain. We would like to remind parents that we are not able to authorise children's absence for the purpose of holiday during term time. It is important that parents understand that if they remove their child from school and incur unauthorised absences, they may be subject to a penalty notice as explained on our Leave of Absence Request Form. In line with government regulations, Cornwall Council has issued penalty notices to members of our school community already this academic year.

'If your child is absent from school without authorisation, you will be committing an offence under the Education Act 1996. We may submit a request to Cornwall Council for a Penalty Notice to be issued, in accordance with Sections 444A and 444B of the said Act. Penalty Notices are issued per liable parent, per child and each carry a fine of £80 if paid within 21 days or £160 if paid after this but within 28 days. Failure to pay the Penalty Notice may result in legal action. Absence not authorised by the school may result in a prosecution in the Magistrates' Court under Section 444(1) or Section 444(1A) of the Education Act 1996, leading to a fine of up to £2,500 and/or a custodial sentence. Cornwall Council may also apply for the costs incurred in taking the matter to Court.'

Please ensure the School Office are notified of all planned absences by completing the appropriate Absence Request Form from our the School Office or website: <u>LOA Primary - Exceptional Circumstances Leave Request Form</u>

As our school now has to monitor 'broken weeks' of children's attendance; when children incur two or more broken weeks, staff will contact parents to offer any support as needed.

Lateness:

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We would also like to request that parents and families make every effort to arrive at school on time, between 8:30am and 8:45am. It's always best for children to have a calm and settled start to their day and this really helps set their learning day up properly too. Lateness causes lots of disruptions in classrooms and is also lost learning time too. Parents should also note that arrivals after 9.15am have to be marked in registers as 'unauthorised absence' for the morning session.



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
